


## *Regional urology center for male, female & pediatric patients*

## **LOCATION & DRIVING DIRECTIONS**

**From Oregon:** After you cross the Lewis & Clark Bridge stay on Oregon Way until you come to the light at Tennant Way. Burger King is on the corner. Turn right. Stay on Tennant Way. Turn at the third light onto 9th Avenue. We are in the first building on the right called Pacific Surgical Institute. We are located on the first floor of this two-story building.

**From the South:** Travel north on I-5 and take Exit 36 (Longview-Kelso, Industrial Area Exit). Take the overpass over I-5 and cross the Cowlitz River. You will be on Tennant Way (432). As you approach, the speed reduces to 35 miles per hour. Be prepared to take the first left at the first stop light (9th Ave). We are located in the first building on the right called Pacific Surgical Institute. We are located on the first floor of the two-story building.




